Are You A Barrier For People To Meet Their Savior?

From the Associate Pastor **47** When he heard that it was Jesus the Nazarene, he began to cry out, "Son of David, Jesus, have mercy on me!" **48** Many people told him to keep quiet, but he was crying out all the more, "Have mercy on me, Son of David!" **49** Jesus stopped and said, "Call him." Mark 10:47-49 HCSB

In a recent daily devotional, Pastor Alistair Begg used the story from Mark 10 about the blind man Bartimaeus. Pastor Begg related how Bartimaeus would often sit at the city gate. This is where those in need would congregate and seek assistance because it was a very busy place. The beggars were always there and because they were, the people of the city often disregarded them. They had become so calloused of their presence that they didn't even hear their constant pleas for help.

The story of Bartimaeus happens on an important day due to the fact that there was a great sense of anticipation that Jesus was coming. And this too – the anticipation of seeing Jesus – was another reason why the people didn't even recognize the beggars and the others in need of assistance at the city gate. They were too focused on the anticipated appearance of Jesus.

But Bartimaeus was undeterred. He shouted out all the more to Jesus "Have mercy on me, Son of David!" Did you notice what the people did? In verse 48 of Mark 10 it reads: *Many people told him to be quiet.* Pastor Begg's comments on what came next are telling, and I quote them here:

This particular blind man didn't have merely a minor interest in Jesus, though, so he continued crying out to Him. Mark's narrative demonstrates Christ's perfect compassion with a simple phrase: "Jesus stopped"—two words of grace. Can you imagine the crowd's reaction when Jesus said to the people who had been rebuking the man, "Call him"? That surely brought a measure of deserved embarrassment!

Perhaps there are people in your life for whom you struggle to pray. Maybe there are some you just want to rebuke or ignore. Maybe you just don't want to deal with the inconvenience. It can seem like such a nuisance to invite somebody to church, sit with them, eat with them, and be involved in their lives. It is messy, and it demands time and effort. We'd rather such people heard the gospel from someone else. It is so easy to slip into this way of thinking without really noticing; but when we do, we become just like the crowd: a barrier to people meeting their Savior. Jesus says to us: "Don't rebuke them. Call them. This is precisely why I came."

Christianity has fallen on hard times. God's Word, His Truth and Jesus' sacrifice for our sins has not changed through the years, but human's response to it has definitely changed. We humans want to pick and choose what to believe. We humans want to pick and choose who will hear the Good News of Jesus Christ. We humans want an easy faith that doesn't disrupt our schedule or our preferences.

And Friedberg is no stranger to this phenomenon. We are finding it more and more difficult to find volunteers to serve on Boards, to usher, to be deiners and coffee carriers, to teach, to serve in the nurseries, to fill our sanctuary with worshippers as it was before the pandemic (perhaps we will have to start labeling time with a "BP" – *before the pandemic* and an "AP" – *after the pandemic*). We humans are finding it more and more difficult to share our faith and to invite others to worship with us.

All I know is that Christianity has the Good News that everyone needs. It is the only place to find real freedom. It is the only place where we find true purpose for living. It is the only place where we are forgiven of our sins and are promised life eternal with Jesus our Savior and Lord and with our Heavenly Father.

But there are millions out there looking for that freedom and purpose and forgiveness – but they don't know where to look. Or, unfortunately, sometimes they do know where to look, but when they reach out they encounter people like blind Bartimaeus did – people who didn't want them to be part of their crowd and didn't want to be bothered with the hard work of helping someone know Jesus Christ as their Savior and Lord. .

To bring this all home, let me quote Pastor Begg: *May God forgive us when we, like the crowd, are full of indignation at the interference to our plans and inconvenience to our preferences caused by those who are crying out for His mercy. Christ alone does the work of opening blind eyes, but He has entrusted us with the responsibility and privilege of proclaiming these words: "Take heart ... He is calling you."*

SUMMER IS HERE!!!





Ohio Mission Trip


June 24th – July 1st
