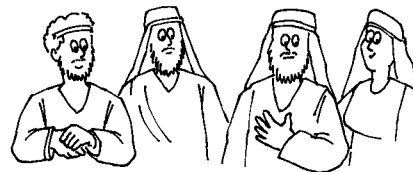

Jesus went to eat at the house of an important Pharisee. He watched the guests choose their seats at the table.

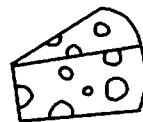

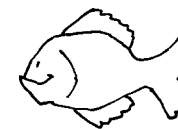

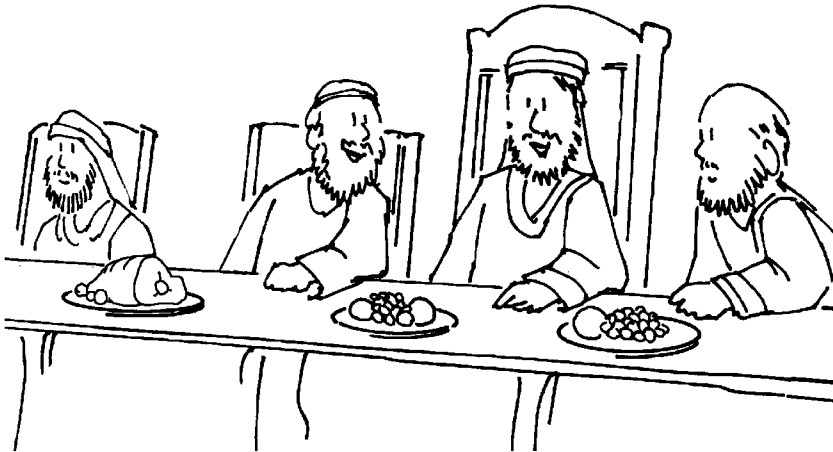
