This week in Friedberg's History: April 13, 1754, a Lovefeast was held in celebration of the Great Sabbath, the first time in Wachovia. The first Easter service on the graveyard was held April 15, 1770. After the Easter Liturgy was completed at the church, the congregation gathered around the graves of Peter Frey, Sr., Johannes Frey and Johannes Walk for the conclusion of the Liturgy.




