This week in Friedberg's History: Mr. Henry Wesley Foltz, a member of Wachovia Historical Society, urged the Society to purchase and preserve the Rock House property. Mr. Foltz began preparing to assist in raising funds for the project by compiling a book, Descendants of Spach, published in 1924. The proceeds of the sale of the book established the Adam Spach Rock House Fund, which helped provide for the purchase of the property in 1930. On October 9, 1927, Mr. Foltz presented a program on the life of Adam Spach at the Rock House site, and nearly 1,000 descendants and neighbors were in attendance. On June 9, 1930, two deeds were recorded giving Wachovia Historical Society ownership of the property and an avenue of approach.






