This week in Friedberg's History: The Moravian star (Herrnhut star) originated in Saxony, Germany, in the two towns of Niesky and Kleinwalka in the 1830s. The stars were used as craft projects to help demonstrate geometry lessons to young boys attending Moravian school. The stars were quickly adopted by the Moravian Church as a symbol of the birth of Jesus and represented the star of Bethlehem. Traditionally, the star is hung the first Sunday of Advent and remains up until Epiphany, January 6. The star reminds us of God, who caused the light to shine out of darkness and of the light which is the life of humanity. It reminds us of the promise of Abraham that his descendants would be more numerous than the stars; we are reminded of the star that pointed to the "great and heavenly light from Bethlehem's manger shining bright." The Light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it.

Commissioning of Mission Teams

Beginning on November 24th, four Friedberg Moravian Missionaries will be participating in a mission trip to the villages of Chapi and Bajo Canampa in Peru. The missionaries will be surveying the villages and surrounding areas for specific needs of a medical clinic team to travel in Peru in 2024. They will also fellowship with fellow Moravians and demonstrate our support of the worldwide unity of the Moravian Church.

Today it is our privilege and joy to commission them as representatives of our Savior and Lord, Jesus Christ, and their congregations.

At this time, I would ask all members of the Mission Team to please come forward.

(Addressing the Friedberg Congregation)

Members of the Friedberg Congregation, as we send these brothers and sisters in Christ on their journey with our love and support, will you pledge to pray for them daily until their safe return to us?

If this is your desire, then respond by saying: We will.

(Prayer)

Gracious Heavenly Father, Your Son, our Savior, and Lord Jesus Christ, before He ascended to glory, declared that Your people would receive power from the Holy Spirit to be His witnesses to people everywhere. So, we pray for our brothers and sisters in Christ who go forth in Jesus' name to serve in Peru. Protect them throughout their journey and bring them home safely. Fill them with Your Spirit and let Your love shine through their words, attitudes, and actions so that everyone they meet and everyone they serve may see Your glory and be drawn closer to You. We pray in Jesus' name, Amen.

Following Christ by Empowering Others for 45 years



Sunnyside Ministry turns 45 years old today!

"Be dressed for action and have your lamps lit." Luke 12:35, is the watchword for the day Sunnyside Ministry was dedicated. We have lived this message as a place where all Moravians have "let their light shine" for 45 years!

It is what Moravians do.

Mission, service to our neighbors, loving those we have called "the least, the last, the lost" since the birth of our church.

In 1978, the Southern Province went into a high poverty neighborhood and started to feed the hungry and clothe our neighbor needing decent clothing. We then added help with rent and utilities. Our service grew.

We did not know that the small ministry we created in 1978 would be feeding families in all parts of Forsyth and Davidson Counties, that Sunnyside Ministry would grow into one of the largest crisis ministries in Forsyth and Davidson Counties.

Sunnyside Ministry was described by one Moravian minister as a "God Thing" and truly God has been with the ministry since before it started. Sunnyside Ministry has served as the hands, feet and heart of Christ in a community that is among the most depressed in the entire state of North Carolina.

Today, Sunnyside Ministry provides food, clothing, financial assistance, financial literacy education and scholarships. Serving one out of every four people living in southern Forsyth County.

The next 45 years!

After 45 years, you might think we would want to take a break and relax, but the need is still there. The need is even greater than it was in 1978, even 1998, or 2018. Since 2018, we have provided help to one out of every four people in Southern Forsyth County.

We have made it through a global pandemic, which tested our resolve and resources. As we look to our 46th year, which begins November 27, we are feeding more families than ever and the requests for rent and utilities are higher than ever before. We do an average of 60 interviews each day for services.

In order to continue to be the ministry the Moravian Church created us to be, we need your help.

We need your time, talent and treasure:

- We need your help as a volunteer. We have many openings and can find a place for you. Helping our neighbors find clothing, helping our neighbors with food or interviewing for financial assistance.
- We need talented people to serve on committees.
- We need help with your donations of food, clothing and money.

These gifts help insure the ministry the Moravian Church created 45 years ago is able to help our neighbors for the next 45 years.




