This week in Friedberg's History: December 25, 1770, the first Christmas Lovefeast was held at Friedberg. A violin, played by Peter Volz, was used to provide music for the singing. The children were given honey cakes and Bible verses at the service. The Friedberg diary states, "The children were full of wonder and joy, it being the first time they had attended such a service." Moravian candles were first used in America at the 1752 Christmas Eve service for children in Bethlehem. This occasion was recorded in the Bethlehem Diary: "Br. Graff held a service for the children in which a small burning candle was distributed to each child. Their hearts and ours rejoiced with play and song over the birth of our Savior."
