The 23rd Psalm, And Two More Psalms You Should Know

Did you know that the Book of Psalms (the hymn book of

ancient Israel) is the largest of the sixty-six books in the Bible? The Book of Psalms contains 150 psalms and King David wrote an amazing one-half of them.

David was a shepherd, musician, prophet, sinner, soldier, and the first divinely appointed king of Israel. He ruled the nation for almost 40 years. All of his psalms are sacred and precious, but one of them — the 23rd Psalm — is probably the most well known and beloved chapter in all of God's Word.

Surrounding the 23rd Psalm are two lesser known, but important psalms which serve to enhance its meaning and significance in a powerful way.

Psalm 22 is sometimes called the "<u>The Psalm of the</u> <u>Cross</u>." It points to the suffering and death of Jesus and in some ways provides a more vivid description of His crucifixion than the New Testament gospels. It opens with the same poignant words Christ would speak while dying on the cross more than a 1000 years later: "My God, my God, why hast Thou forsaken me?" (Matthew 27:46). The mocking of the crowds as they pass by in Psalm 22:7 is echoed in the New Testament with these words: "And those who passed by derided Him, wagging their heads ..." (Matthew 27:39ff). The many references in the New Testament connected to this psalm all point to the cross and were fulfilled in Jesus Christ.

King David's 23rd Psalm can be called "<u>The Psalm of</u> <u>the Crook</u>" — the crook being a curved shepherd's staff. This psalm is just six short verses, but is perhaps the most beautiful, profound, and comforting words of truth ever written. It is about a shepherd, but not just any shepherd — this Shepherd is the Lord! And if we, by faith, genuinely know Him as our Lord, then we truly are His sheep and are dependent on Him for all things.

The shepherd carries with him a "rod," a straight and sturdy stick with which to protect the sheep; a "staff," used for walking and support; and/or a "crook," a large stick with a curved end which is used to rescue a sheep that has wandered off and fallen into a crevice or a pit. Believers who read the 23rd Psalm know that its promises and depth of meaning for the child of God cannot be overstated.

The 24th Psalm can be called "**The Psalm of the** <u>**Crown**</u>." It begins with this bold and comforting declaration: "The earth is the Lord's and the fullness thereof; the world and those who dwell therin." The psalm continues to exalt God powerfully, leaving no room for debate or speculation: "Lift up your heads, O gates! And be lifted up, O ancient doors, that the King of glory may come in. Who is this King of glory? The Lord, strong and mighty, the Lord, mighty in battle!" (Psalm 24:7-8, ESV).

I hope you will read each of these wonderful psalms. As you do take note of how one builds upon another in a beautiful and harmonious progression. Together they paint a glorious picture of Christ's redemptive work and His love for us in the past, present, and future.

Psalm 22 is "The Psalm of the Cross"

It is an event of the past that continues on today. Jesus, the Holy Son of God, came to pay a debt He did not owe because we owed a debt we could not pay.

Psalm 23 is "The Psalm of the Crook"

Today and everyday, God's goodness and mercy follow us, and His rod and staff promise to bring us comfort, protection, rescue, and correction as needed.

Psalm 24 is "The Psalm of the Crown"

Our sure and certain hope is that Jesus is coming again in power and great glory and will purge all that has been defiled in our world since the fall of humanity in the Garden of Eden long ago.

So, as we continue to move forward in 2024 let us remember that no matter what life brings — whether it be poor health, wayward children, financial challenges, job insecurities, social and political upheaval in our country, or military conflicts overseas — we are more than conquerors through Christ who loves us. In Him, we are on the victorious side and one day will we reign with Him forever. Until that glorious day, for as long as we draw breath, let us live each day in the strength He supplies.


February's verse to focus on will be:


