“Soft” Or “Hard?”

When I would take trips up to Wisconsin to visit my parents I was always confronted about my preference for butter. My mother used to keep butter in the refrigerator and would only take it out a minute or two before mealtime. That meant that the butter was always hard. I don't like hard butter. It's hard to spread; it's hard to get an even "coat" on your bread; as you try and spread it, it makes the bread crumble. "Soft" butter is so much easier to use.

What I didn't realize is that my mom kept the butter in the refrigerator due to the fact that is how my father liked his butter. My dad agreed with the old Norwegian saying: *Unless you can see your teeth marks in the butter when you take a bite of bread, you don't have enough butter!* Having "Hard" butter allowed my dad to pile it on thick so he could see his teeth marks. My dad also liked to eat butter like cheese - he would cut off a slice and eat it plain. You can't do that with "Soft" butter.

Ice Cream is another one of those things that people like either "Soft" or "Hard." Judy and my son Ben like their ice cream on the "Soft" side. I, on the other hand, like my ice cream as "Hard" as it can possibly be (imagine that - Judy and I liking/thinking/preferring different things).

Did you know that the Bible commands us to make part of our bodies "Soft?" The writer of the book of Hebrews wrote: *“Do not harden your hearts as you did in the rebellion, during the time of testing...”* (Hebrews 3:8). We are commanded to have "Soft," hearts that are open to the work of God in and around us.

How open are we to the Holy Spirit's leading and work in our lives? How easily do we accept the place and the assignment that God has given us as we live in this world? How do we react when we are spiritually tested? How do we respond when we fail by giving in to temptation?

If we are honest with ourselves, we would have to admit that we don't always (or often) do a very good job of following Jesus and being the examples and witnesses we are asked to be. We are probably more like the Disciples in their earlier days when Jesus would get frustrated by their lack of faith and understanding. Or maybe we are like the Israelites who grumbled at God and wandered from Him even though they were on the receiving end of all of God's grace.

For the rest of the season of Lent (and for the rest of our lives), let's commit ourselves to dare to attempt to live our lives with "Softened Hearts" while we live in this world that is often cold, harsh, and hard-hearted.

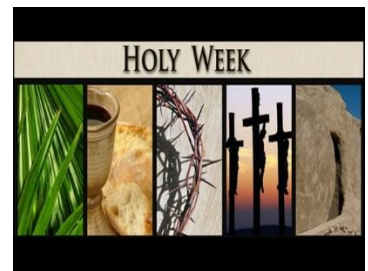

Friedberg Moravian Youth Mission Statement

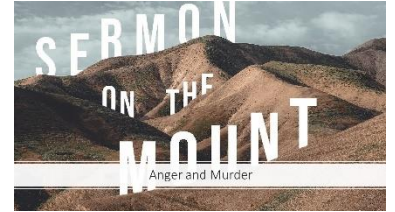

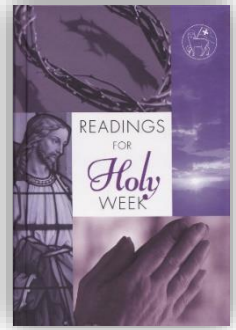

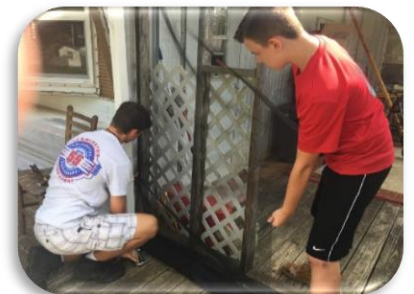
Fundraiser: Pine Needles (April 5th and 6th)
