Because He Lives

Because I live, you also will live. (John 14:19b)

Several years ago, a school teacher, who served on special assignment with children who were patients in a large hospital, received a routine call requesting that she visit a particular child who had been admitted and would require a long time to recuperate. She took the boy's name and room number (409) and then called his regular teacher to find out what she needed to cover. "We're studying nouns and adverbs," the teacher said. "This boy needs help so he will not fall behind."

It wasn't until the visiting teacher reached the boy's room that she realized it was located in the hospital's burn unit. No one had prepared her to confront a boy who had been horribly burned over much of his body and was suffering excruciating pain. She wanted to turn on her heel and walk right back out, but instead she stammered the words, "I'm the hospital

teacher and your regular teacher asked me to help you with nouns and adverbs."

Because of his condition, the boy could barely respond. The teacher stumbled through the grammar lessons, but felt guilty for even asking the boy questions or trying to correct him.

The next morning, however, the teacher ran into a nurse from the burn unit who asked her, "What did you do to the boy in room 409 yesterday?" The teacher started to apologize, but the nurse interrupted, "You don't understand. We've been terribly concerned about him. Until yesterday he seemed to have given up. But ever since you saw him, his whole attitude has changed. He's fighting back, responding to treatment, like he wants to live.

The boy himself later explained, with tears brimming in his eyes, "I had given up. I wanted to die. It was at my lowest moment that the teacher came into my room. I suddenly realized that they wouldn't send a teacher to work on nouns and adverbs with a dying boy, would they? I decided I wanted to get well, if they thought I could. So I prayed, asking God to help me want to live. And here I am!"

The story above stirs in me emotions that are similar to those I experience in the journey through season of Lent and Holy Week to Easter Sunday.

As I write this article we are in the midst of Lent, with its focus on the suffering, self-denial and sacrifice of our Lord Jesus Christ. Lent culminates with the somber events of Holy Week and the death of Jesus on the cross. Yet we know that death is not the end of the story - for the grave could not hold our Lord and Savior. Jesus rose again to life, victorious over sin, suffering and even death itself.



The resurrection is our greatest source of hope. It gives us the assurance that our sins are truly forgiven. It lets us know that our Savior is alive and with us even in the midst of our darkest hours. It is a comforting reminder that One who gave His very life for us on the cross and rose triumphant from the grave is more than able to give us what we need for each

and every circumstance of our lives. He will never leave us; never forsake us; never fail us. Sometimes He comes to us in unexpected ways (as He did through the teacher in the story above), but He never fails to come.

The gospel hymn writers Bill and Gloria Gaither got it so very right when they penned these beautiful words:

God sent His Son - they called Him Jesus; He came to love, heal and forgive. He lived and died to buy my pardon; An empty grave is there to prove my Savior lives.

Because He lives I can face tomorrow; Because He lives, all fear is gone. Because I know He holds the future, And life is worth the living just because He lives.

May we all, empowered by the Holy Spirit, live each day in the unconquerable hope and inexhaustible joy of Christ's resurrection. Life truly is worth the living ... just because He lives.




