Food pick-up and packing of boxes will be on Friday, July 19 and distribution will be on the afternoon of Saturday July 20. These distributions will be done quarterly, and our hope is that other Sunday School classes will be willing to participate in the future. On Sunday, June 30 and July 7, there will be an opportunity for all to participate in this ministry by giving a special offering to collect the \$2,100 needed to purchase the food. In addition, bins will be placed in the church hallways for members to fill with toothbrushes, toothpaste, toilet paper, snacks (Lance crackers, for example), which will also be distributed. Please pray for the success of this project and what you can do to help. It is a huge undertaking, but no more so than the need of those who are experiencing food insecurity, and who need the love of Jesus demonstrated to them.

We will also be receiving a love offering today for the Otovskyi family. Dimi and Slava Otovskyi sustained severe injuries in an automobile accident on June 9. Dimi is still a patient at Atrium Health Wake Forest Baptist and both he and Slava are facing surgeries in the coming days and weeks. Their needs will be ongoing. 


