Outsiders

Imagine that you're in a deep sleep, enjoying your time of rest when you wake up to the words: "Wake Up!" Those words can be said in a soothing manner, such as, "Wake up, honey, it's time for ______ (school, work, dinner, church, etc.)." Or those words can be said in a jolting manner: "Wake up! Don't you know what time it is? You're gonna be late! You better get out of bed RIGHT NOW!!!!"

I don't know why, but lately it seems that many of the things I've been listening to or reading or watching are all about being aware and "waking up" to reality.

It seems the news I watch on TV (is there even really any true "news" anymore or is it all just opinion) makes me think that we have to wake up to what is going on in the world.

Many of the conversations I've had and some of the devotions I've read also point to the fact that we must "wake up" and get involved, or start saving money, or begin helping each other out, or take time for what is really important.

Even some of the songs I've listened to remind me to "wake up."

The world in which we live is so seductive. We have heard the Truth of the Gospel of Jesus Christ over and over again in Worship, Sunday School, Bible Studies, in our Devotions, and on the radio. We have been blessed with Godly Sunday School Teachers, Pastors, Youth and Children Leaders, and Bible Study Teachers who have all helped us understand what God desires for us and of us. The world in which we live does not have the same priorities, purposes and morals that God's Kingdom does and the result of that tension is that we Christians often get side-tracked in our faith walk with God. We forget the admonition from the Apostle Paul in Romans 2:2

Do not conform any longer to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind. Then you will be able to test and approve what God's will is -His good, pleasing and perfect will.

As children of God, we are not supposed to mirror the world. We are not to have the same priorities as the world has. We are to be different. One of the songs I've been listening to is a "golden oldie" from the Christian band *Need To Breathe*. In the song it makes the analogy that we Christians are "Outsiders." The sooner we realize that we are outsiders - that our devotion and allegiance is to God, not this world - the better off we will be. The problem is that we've been duped into thinking that as "outsiders" we will miss out on something - we will miss out on truly enjoying life.

What a lie! Satan wants us to think that we are missing out on something if we live for Jesus, but the reality - the Truth - of the situation is that living as an "outsider" - living for Jesus - is the only way we will experience true life and true love. It's the only way we can truly serve, truly see, and truly have peace, joy and contentment in this life. Only as an "outsider" do we truly have a home.

Where do you live? Have you been transformed by God or have you conformed to the ways of the world? Do you live for pleasure and respect of the world? Or are you one of God's "Outsider's," living and loving Him with all that you've got?

Friedberg Moravian Church is partnering with Fairview Moravian Church to provide food distribution to those in our communities who are facing food insecurity. FMC will host a distribution on Saturday, July 20 in our church parking lot to serve our immediate neighborhood. The Discovery Class has agreed to help with this first event. Food pick-up and packing of boxes will be on Friday, July 19 and distribution will be on the afternoon of Saturday July 20. These distributions will be done quarterly, and our hope is that other Sunday School classes will be willing to participate in the future. On Sunday, June 30 and July 7, there will be an opportunity for all to participate in this ministry by giving a special offering to collect the \$2,100 needed to purchase the food. In addition, bins will be placed in the church hallways for members to fill with toothbrushes, toothpaste, toilet paper, snacks (Lance crackers, for example), which will also be distributed. Please pray for the success of this project and what you can do to help. It is a huge undertaking, but no more so than the need of those who are experiencing food insecurity, and who need the love of Jesus demonstrated to them.



Staff members maintain a fleet of disaster response vehicles, including five tractor-trailers – known as Disaster Relief Units – stocked with heavy-duty tarps, generators, chainsaws, and other tools to aid in cleanup efforts. The youth will tour this facility to become familiar with the organization that assists in disaster relief around the world. Samaritan's Purse, headed by Franklin Graham, is an international Christian relief and evangelism organization working in more than 100 countries to provide aid to victims of war, disease, poverty, famine, and persecution. After the tour, we'll head to Berry Mountain Park for a picnic and swimming. Bring a packed lunch, towel, sunscreen, and bathing suit.

2024 Laurel Ridge Mission Camp

"With man this is impossible, but with God, all things are possible" Matthew 19:26.

On Monday, when we entered the old school building, we felt overwhelmed. The amount of work that needed to be done seemed impossible. The homeowner, Cindi, shared a testimony about her past, an update on her current situation, and future goals for the school. Cindi was a victim of physical and mental abuse. She had a vision from God to buy the old school and create a safe place for women and children to live and heal. She plans to sell her house in Virginia and move into the old school with her children. Cindi, who is a mother of eight children, also takes care of two additional children who live in an abusive situation. She is an amazing Christian woman with a God-sized goal. It was an honor and a privilege to be a part of her journey this week. During our time there, we were able to install bathroom doors, place blocks in the framed walls, sort clothing, move furniture, organize boxes, repair equipment, mow the grass, weed eat, place blocks around the blueberry bushes, and move cabinets and other furniture out of the old gym. As the week went on, we began to embrace Cindi's vision for the future, and the feeling of being overwhelmed faded away.

This old school was called Healing Springs High School, which opened in 1929 and closed in 1990. The school had been abandoned for over 30 years until Cindi purchased it a few years ago. In those 30 years, the school had been neglected and was in decay. God has called her to repair this neglected building and to create a place where God can help heal the brokenness within future women and children. Please pray for Cindi as she serves a God who cares about His children.
