And when you get to part in each prayer regarding personal and national sins, be honest and specific about the sins God brings to mind for you and those He brings to mind for our country.

Through these days of prayer may God mold us more and more into the people He desires us to be — and may He hear from heaven, forgive our sin, and heal our land.

In the very beginning Jerry and I told Dan that we did not feel alone in this. We knew up front that our Friedberg family would step up and provide all that would be needed. We also knew that we needed to take one day at a time knowing that each day had enough troubles of its own. Our Lord tells us, we do not need to worry about tomorrow. It is in His hands.

Dima is doing very well at home. He has balancing issues and a few cognitive issues but is improving each day. We can tell that the nerves on the right side of his face are healing since he is beginning to open his eye a bit. He has much ahead of him and has appointments scheduled with the wound center, ENT, neurology and ophthalmology. He also has OT and PT with neurology that will begin in August. The trauma doctors give God the glory for Dima's miraculous recovery.

Slava is doing great. She was released from the neurologist yesterday. She has a lot of damage in her mouth and is scheduled with an oral surgeon. She is scheduled with plastics for nose and other fractures. Her eye is healing but she continues on several eye drops. She will not regain sight in her left eye. She also continues with PT for her elbow. We are hoping there is no tendon damage and that her elbow will be completely healed.

The boys are doing good. They are very happy to spend time with their grandmother, whom they had not seen in almost two years.

Dima's mother arrived in the US on Friday and is very happy to be with her family. She is cooking and cleaning and doing all the things a mother and grandmother loves to do in caring for her family. There is no better medicine than the love and care of a Mother/Grandmother.

Dima and Slava have several surgeries and a lot of PT ahead of them. They have strong faith and love for Jesus and with the help of The Great Physician, the Friedberg congregation and others I know they will be ok



CHILDREN'S CHURCH


Sunday, August 4, 11, and 25 during the 11:00am service

- 22. Share with God's people who are in need. Practice Hospitality. Pray for Phil and Eunice Raiford in Mexico.
- 23. The one who plants and the one who waters have one purpose, and each will be rewarded according to their own labor. For we are God's fellow workers; you are God's field, God's building. Pray for the Rajpur Foster Child Project.
