Revival, Renewal, Awakening? Or Just More Of The “Same ol’ same ol’?”

With all that’s been going on in the world, and with the way that many individuals, congregations and denominations are straying from the Truth of God’s Word, it has all made me think seriously about the idea of Revival, Renewal, Awakening, or Reaching Out to others and having them recommit themselves to the faith they once had in God the Father and Jesus the Son, or to surrender themselves to Them for the very first time.

There have been hundreds of regional or local awakenings (or revivals) in the United States (such as the Asbury Revival in 2023), but the last great National Revivals in the United States happened a long time ago: *The First Great Awakening* (1730-1755); *The Second Great Awakening* (1790-1840); and *The Businessmen’s Revival* (1857-58).

That *Businessmen’s Revival* began with one man’s burning passion to reach those who didn’t know Jesus. That man’s name was Jeremiah Lanphier. He had no theological background or training. He was a businessman in New York. He quit his job to become a *City Missionary* for a church that was dwindling in membership, but was concerned for the spiritual state of the families in Lower Manhattan.

Lanphier decided to start a prayer meeting that would be held from 12noon to 1:00pm in the back room of his church. He printed flyers and distributed them inviting people to come to the prayer meeting. He invited them to stay for 10 minutes or the whole hour, but to come and ask the Lord to revive and renew. At that first prayer meeting Lanphier showed up a little before 12noon. No one showed up. He sat alone in that room for 30 minutes, but then six people showed up – and those six prayed. By the third week there were 40 people showing up for prayer. At one point, there were crowds of up to 3,000 people meeting for prayer. One thing led to another and *The Businessmen’s Revival* was in full swing. During *The Businessmen’s Revival* historians agree that approximately 1 million Americans – out of a total national population of 30 million – confessed faith in Jesus Christ.

We all say that the United States needs Revival, or Renewal or an Awakening, and every great revival/awakening began with prayer. That’s true in our own Moravian context/history, too. The great spiritual awakening of August 13, 1727 led to 100 years of continuous prayer. And after five years of praying and preparing and discerning, the Moravians felt led to send out Missionaries (David Nitschmann and Leonhard Dober) to the West Indies in 1732.

But prayer isn’t all that we do. After we have prayed for a time (for the Moravians it was five years of praying discerning God’s direction, for Lanphier it was a three-month time of preparation that led to his noon-time prayer meeting which then turned into *The Businessmen’s Revival*) we then must decide to act – to respond to God’s Call. But first we must humble ourselves, rearrange our lives (if need be), and discern God’s call for us – both individually and also corporately as Friedberg Moravian Church.

What are we (what are you) willing to do to prepare, to humble ourselves, and to discern God’s will for where and what He is leading us to do? If we are only willing to talk about it and identify the difficulties (and remember, opportunities are nothing more than issues brilliantly disguised as difficulties) without being willing to make some changes, and step out in faith, nothing will change.

May God inspire, convict, guide, direct and lead us into action as we discern for ourselves and our church what He would have us do to bring about Renewal, Revival or Awakening.

What Is The Bethel Bible Series?

The *Bethel Bible Series* is a program that equips students to apply the Scriptures to their lives. In fact, our textbook is the Bible. The *Bethel Bible Series* presents a biblical overview in a language that is easy to understand.

Frequently Asked Questions:

- How long are the classes?** - 75 minutes in length
- How many classes are there?** – Three seven-week sessions
- How much of a commitment do I sign up for?** -Each student makes a 7-week commitment. Each new session will have a new sign-up period
- Is there a cost?** – The cost for the Workbook is \$60
- What day will it meet?** -New Testament: Thursday Evenings - 7:00 p.m. to 8:15 p.m. -Old Testament: Thursday Afternoons – 1:30pm to 2:45pm
- When does it start?** –October 3, 2022

If *The Bethel Bible Series* sounds like what you have been looking for, contact the office by September 8, 2024. The classes will be filled on a first come - first served basis with any additional names being put on a waiting list. **Please Note:** Successful completion of the Old Testament Class is required to sign up for the New Testament Class.

For the past several years Friedberg has offered both Old Testament and New Testament Bethel Bible Classes (***Congregational Phase Classes***). Over 100 people at Friedberg have participated in these classes. This year we will also be offering ***Intensive Teacher/Discipleship Training Program***.

Students in the ***Intensive*** phase of the Bethel Series program will be taken on a journey into the Scriptures through a disciplined two-year training phase.

This is your invitation to participate in the ***INTENSIVE TEACHER/DISCIPLESHIP TRAINING PROGRAM***.

What are the requirements of those who volunteer?

1. Each trainee will spend **2 ½ hours a week in a study session** with the instructors over a two-year period – 3 seven-week sessions each year.
2. Trainees can expect to spend **6-10 hours per week doing homework** which includes learning **about 15 Biblical concepts per week**.
3. All members of the ***Intensive Class*** will **write exams and do projects** as the study progresses.
4. Each trainee will pay a registration fee of \$60 per year to cover the cost of the textbook and other teaching materials.
5. **When the training program is completed, each trainee will be available to serve**, not only through teaching other adults in our congregation using the Bethel Series as the format for their studies, but also through a demonstration of discipleship through a variety of leadership roles in our congregation.

As you can see, the requirements are demanding. It will take courage, dedication and perseverance, but **IT WILL BE WELL WORTH ALL THE EFFORT!** If you volunteer

and are accepted for this teacher/discipleship training program, you will know more about the Bible than you have ever known before. You will have covered all 66 books of the Bible from Genesis to Revelation. You will be trained in teaching methods and laws of communication and will be well equipped to teach the Bible to other members of our congregation.

Pray about it. This is a challenge which can prepare you for the important work of teaching the Scriptures and serving in many other areas in our church. Please volunteer with the intent of being ready and willing to give your whole heart, mind and energy to this effort.

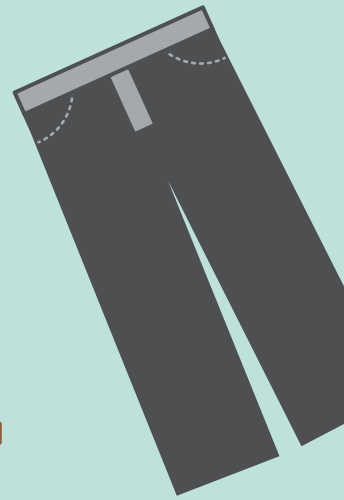

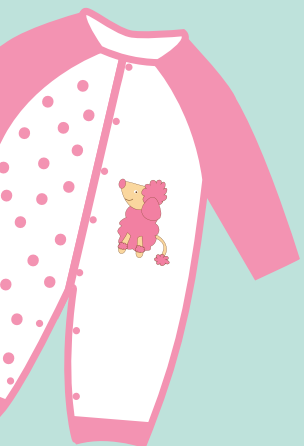

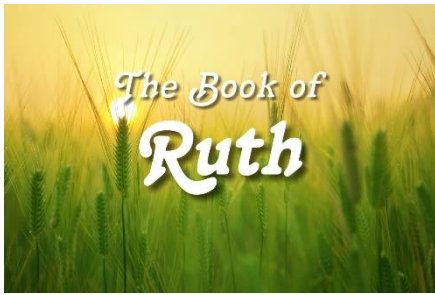
Messiah's Mansion
