Bright Beginnings/Confirmation at Friedberg Moravian Church

Confirmation has taken a slightly different look with the addition of Bright Beginnings! Here at Friedberg our Mission Statement is "We are a congregation grounded in Biblical truth. Honoring our heritage and deep faith in the Lord Jesus Christ by proclaiming openly the Gospel through worship, witness, Bible study, missions, fellowship and service to the community."

Our goal for the Bright Beginnings program is to add to our Confirmation program by helping to build a stronger foundation not only for our children and youth but also for families as well to connect to what we feel is important as stated in our Mission Statement.

There will be two different opportunities for Bright Beginnings to be attended in the coming months. The child and at least one parent would come on October 19 or May 3 from 9:00am-3:00pm and spend time with Pastor Dan, Pastor Jim, Heidi and Karen as we walk through some aspects of building a stronger foundation of faith at an earlier age starting in the home. Our findings have been that more and more children/parents sign their child up to go through Confirmation not really knowing what all it entails and not fully being ready to go through it. Now, we know it's not our place to say a child is ready or not, but it is our pace to help our children and families to be as prepared for their faith journeys as much as we possibly can.




