What a day for a daydream, What a day for a day-dreamin' boy, And now I'm lost in a daydream, Dreamin' 'bout my bundle of iov. -The Lovin' Spoonful

The quote above is from an old 60's song sung by a group called "The Lovin' Spoonful." I was nine years old and just beginning to listen to the popular music my older brothers and sisters listened to, and this is one of the first songs I remember liking. That song popped into my head the other day as I began to think about our church, my retirement and the approaching New Year. Now, I know the song is about dreaming about a girl friend and wandering around in a state of ignorant bliss. I'm not suggesting that our church, or me in my retirement or we in the New Year should wander around daydreaming in a state of ignorant bliss. Instead I'm going to suggest that we be a little more specific and focused than that - but I am going to encourage you to daydream a little, with the help, guidance and direction of the Holy Spirit.

It's my belief that the older we get the less daydreaming we do. It's also my belief that as we daydream guided by the Holy Spirit - we are let in on the secrets of God. Now the word "daydreamin" might create thoughts of "wasted time" or "long-haired hippy-freak la-la land wanderings." So, if "daydreaming" takes you to a place you don't want to go, pick another word that is similar - a word like "meditate," or "contemplate," or "muse," or "reckon," or "suppose," or "imagine," or "reflect." There are any number of words that will do (but I'm going to use the phrase "daydreaming").

Once you decide on the word you want to use - take some time to daydream. With a busy schedule its hard to take time exclusively for daydreaming. So get creative: daydream while you're in the shower; while you're driving (but be careful); while you're cleaning house; while you're doing laundry; while you're cooking supper.

And what I'd like for you to daydream about is your faith and our congregation:

- -Am I a faithful Believer?
- -What can I do to deepen my relationship with Jesus, my Savior and Lord?
- -What can I get involved with at Friedberg in addition to Sunday morning?
- -Am I doing my part to fulfill my financial obligations to the church?
- -What could/would I do to enhance the ministry (programs) of our congregation?
- -What could/would I do to enhance the buildings of our church?
- -If money wasn't an issue, what would I like to see done for (or to) Friedberg Moravian?
- -What innovative, creative, unique outreach ideas could we use to reach the people in our neighborhood and beyond?

Please daydream about those things. Then pray about those things. Then act on those things. But we must remember one important key to the whole thing - and that's God's Wisdom and Will for our church.

- -God says He will grant wisdom for all who will ask for it (James 1:5). We want our daydreaming to be led by the Holy Spirit of God.
- -And we must remember to daydream under the theme of "What's Best For Friedberg." not what is best for me.

This New Year (like any other year) has the potential to be a year of great ministry here at Friedberg Moravian Church. Let's each of us do our part to make that a reality.
