Thoughts on Holy Week April 13-20

As we draw near to Holy Week, I invite you to take time to reflect deeply on the story that stands at the very heart of our Christian faith—the suffering, death, and resurrection of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. Holy Week is not simply a series of services on the church calendar. It is a sacred journey, one that invites us to walk closely with Jesus through His final days, to sit with the sorrow of the cross, and then to rise with the joy and power of the resurrection.

The week begins with Palm Sunday, when we remember Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem. The crowd shouted "Hosanna!" and laid palm branches before Him, welcoming Him as a king. And yet, even as we celebrate that moment, we know where the road leads. The cheers of Palm Sunday soon

give way to the jeers of Good Friday. The same crowd that cried "Hosanna" would soon shout "Crucify Him!" The events of this week remind us how quickly the human heart can turn, and how deeply we need the grace and forgiveness of Christ.

On Maundy Thursday, we will gather around the Lord's Table, just as Jesus did with His disciples in the Upper Room. It was on that night that He gave a new commandment: "Love one another as I have loved you." He demonstrated that love by washing His disciples' feet and then offering Himself as the true Passover Lamb. As we share Holy Communion together, we remember that we are bound to Christ—and to one another—by the power of sacrificial love.

Good Friday brings us to the cross. It is a day of sorrow, but not despair. We do not rush past it. We pause. We remember. We stand at the foot of the

cross and acknowledge the cost of our redemption. Jesus bore the weight of our sin, not because we deserved it, but because His love is deeper than our failure, stronger than our shame, and greater than the grave.

And then comes Easter.

Early in the morning, when all seemed lost, the women came to the tomb—and found it empty. The angel's words still echo through history: "He is not here; He is risen!" That single truth changes everything. Because Christ is risen, death does not

have the final word. Because He lives, we have hope—steadfast, eternal hope—that nothing in all creation can separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Easter is not merely a celebration of something that happened long ago. It is a declaration of what is true right now. Christ is alive. He is


present with us, even in our struggles. He is victorious over sin and death. And He invites us to live as Easter people—people marked by faith, courage, generosity, and joy.

I encourage you to walk the full journey of Holy Week. Let the services, the Scriptures, and the story shape your heart and renew your spirit. Whether you are filled with joy or carrying burdens too heavy to name, there is room for you in this story. There is hope for you in the risen Christ.

May the journey through Holy Week deepen your faith, and may the joy of Easter fill your heart with unshakable peace.



April's verse to focus on will be:


"They found the stone rolled away from the tomb, but when they entered, they did not find the body of the Lord Jesus."


