#### Warning Signs and Danger Signals

Whoever remains stiff-necked after many rebukes will suddenly be destroyed — without remedy.

(Hebrews 3:15, NIV)

On the morning of May 18, 1980, Mount St. Helens in Washington State erupted with devastating force. In the most destructive volcanic event in U.S. history, the explosion leveled entire forests, flooded valleys, destroyed hundreds of homes, and claimed 57 lives.

The blast was so powerful it could be heard more than 150 miles away and released energy equivalent to 500 times the atomic bomb dropped on Hiroshima.

But here's the part we dare not miss: it didn't happen without warning.

For weeks leading up to the eruption, the mountain rumbled. Dozens of earth-quakes measuring magnitude 3 or higher were recorded daily. A massive bulge appeared on the north face, a clear sign

that magma was rising. Scientists, including Charles Richter — the developer of the earthquake Richter scale — warned the public of the growing threat. "No one could fail to regard this occurrence with interest and apprehension as to what will be coming next," Richter said in an interview published the day before the eruption.

Officials cordoned off the danger zone and urged people to leave. Some listened. Others protested. One man, 83-year-old Harry Truman, flatly refused to evacuate his lodge on Spirit Lake. Despite repeated warnings, he stayed. When the mountain exploded, Harry was buried under 30 feet of ash and mud — his beloved lodge, and his life, lost forever.

The eruption of Mount St. Helens is a tragic reminder of what happens when we ignore the signs. But it's also a powerful spiritual parable.

In the same way that mountains rumble before they blow, God often sends warnings to alert us to danger in our lives. Sometimes He speaks through Scripture. Sometimes through wise counsel. Sometimes through a restless heart or a quiet whisper of conviction from the Holy Spirit. The Lord is not silent when we are on a path that leads to destruction. He warns us, not to scare us, but to spare us.

But we don't always listen. We brush aside the warning signs and ignore the danger signals. We get defensive. We convince ourselves that we can handle it, that we know better, that the danger isn't

really all that serious. Like those who demanded to re-enter the "danger zone" around Mount St. Helens, we push past boundaries that were meant to protect us. And sometimes, tragically, we suffer the consequences.

That's why Hebrews 3:15 offers this urgent plea:

Today, if you hear His voice, do not harden your hearts.

The voice of God is an invitation — an act of mercy. It calls us away from sin, from bitterness, from compromise, and into His grace, His peace, His protection. But it's up to us to respond while there's still time.

Have you been sensing the Lord speaking to your heart lately? Has He been nudging you to forgive, to surrender, to trust, to come back home?

Don't wait until the mountain moves.

The safest place to be is not near the danger — but near the Savior.



- 9. But because of his great love for us, God, who is rich in mercy, made us alive with Christ even when we were dead in transgressions, it is by grace you have been saved. Pray for short term mission teams.
- 10. For we are God's workmanship, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do. Pray for Safiatu Braima and Sierra Leonne.
- 11. Christ Jesus himself as the chief cornerstone. In him the whole building is joined together and rises to become a holy temple in the Lord. Pray for seminarians and candidates for ordination.
- 12. I became a servant of this gospel by the gift of God's grace given me through the working of his power. Pray for the Moravians in Peru.
- 13. Be completely humble and gentle; be patient, bearing with one another in love. Pray for the Clinica Evangelica Morava in Ahaus.
- 14. I no longer live, but Christ lives in me. The life I live in the body, I live by faith in the Son of God who loved me and gave himself for me. Pray for Moravians in Cuba and the Armando Rusindo Foundation.
- 15. From him the whole body, joined and held together by every supporting ligament, grows and builds itself up in love, as each part does its work. Pray for Moravians in Honduras and Nicaragua.
- 16. Be imitators of God, therefore, as dearly loved children and live a life of love, just as Christ loved us and gave himself up for us as a fragrant offering and sacrifice to God. Pray for the Raipur Foster Child Project.
- 17. Wake up, O sleeper, rise from the dead, and Christ will shine on you. Pray for the Teshes in Kenya and Ray of Hope.
- 18. Serve wholeheartedly, as if you were serving the Lord, not men. Pray for Phil and Eunice Raiford in Mexico.
- 19. Do nothing out of selfish ambition or vain conceit, but in humility consider others better than yourselves. Pray for Joey Yokeley with Fellowship of Christian Athletes.
- 20. I consider everything a loss compared to the surpassing greatness of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord, for whose sake I have lost all things. Pray for Adopt-a-Village in Tanzania.
- 21. Devote yourselves to prayer, being watchful and thankful. Pray for City with Dwellings and ministries to the homeless.
- 22. May the Lord make your love increase and overflow for each other and for everyone else, just as our does for you. Pray for the Hoffmans in HIV/AIDS ministry.
- 23. Be joyful always; pray continually; give thanks in all circumstances, for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus. Pray for Laurel Ridge Mission Camps.
- 24. May God himself, the God of peace, sanctify you through and through. Pray for Kevin and Charity in the Middle East.
- 25. But we ought always to thank God for you, those loved by the Lord, because from the beginning God chose you to be saved through the sanctifying work of the Spirit and through belief in the truth. Pray for the Harrisons with Greek Intervarsity.
- 26. Finally, pray for us that the message of the Lord may spread rapidly and be honored, just as it was with you. Pray for Brian and Heather Marx with Mission Aviation Fellowship.
- 27. I want people everywhere to lift up holy hands in prayer, without anger or disputing. Pray for Alan and DeeDee lobst in France.
- 28. Let us then approach the throne of grace with confidence, so that we may receive mercy and find grace to help us in our time of need. Pray for Annie B Missions and Star Mountain.
- 29. Until I come, devote yourself to the public reading of Scripture, to preaching and to teaching. Pray for the Board of World Mission.
- 30. For this reason, ever since I heard about your faith in the Lord Jesus and your love for all the saints, I have not stopped giving thanks for you, remembering you in my prayer. Pray for Estamos Unidos Moravian Ministry.


