

A Celebration Of Freedom

The Fourth of July is a time to honor our nation's history and to celebrate and give thanks for the freedoms we enjoy as citizens of this great land — the United States of America. It is good and right for us to pause and remember the courage and sacrifices of those who secured our freedoms — men and women who believed that liberty was worth fighting for. May we never take for

granted the sacrifices they made nor the blessings of liberty they secured.

But for followers of Jesus Christ, the celebration of freedom points us to something even deeper and more enduring. While political freedom is precious, it pales in comparison to the ultimate freedom Christ offers — freedom from sin, guilt, fear, and even death itself.

Through His death on the cross and His resurrection from the grave, Jesus has won for us the greatest liberty of all. As the Apostle Paul declared in Romans

6:22, Now that you have been set free from sin and have become servants of God, the benefit you reap leads to holiness, and the result is eternal life.

This spiritual freedom is not earned by effort or guaranteed by any constitution — it is a gift of grace, made possible by Christ's victory over the grave. Just as American patriots laid down their lives to secure our nation's liberty, Jesus laid down His life to set us eternally free. And because of that, we can live not as captives to sin, guilt, fear or shame, but as people redeemed and called to live in joyful obedience to the Lord.

This month, as we celebrate our nation's 249th birthday, I encourage us all to reflect not only on the blessings of national liberty, but also on the

responsibilities that come with our dual citizenship — both as Americans and as members of God's Kingdom. Galatians 5:13 reminds us, You, my brothers and sisters, were called to be free. But do not use your freedom to indulge the flesh; rather, serve one another humbly in love.

So in these days of celebration, let me encourage you to do three things:

Give thanks – Take time to thank God for the freedoms we enjoy: the freedom to worship openly, to speak truthfully, and to live according to our convictions. These are gifts that many around the world still long for.

Pray for our nation – In 1 Timothy 2:1-2, we are instructed to pray for those in authority so that we may live peaceful and godly lives. Let us pray for our leaders — local and national — that they would seek wisdom, govern with justice, and uphold righteousness.

Live out your faith – For Christian citizens of America, patriotism involves more than symbols and ceremonies. It

means living as salt and light in the world, showing kindness, seeking justice, and loving our neighbors. Jesus said, "Let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven" (Matthew 5:16).

This July — and beyond — let us celebrate freedom not just with parades, cookouts, fireworks and fanfare, but with grateful hearts and faithful lives. Because in Christ, we are truly free — free to live every day by grace. Free to live every day to the glory of God!

Friedberg Mission Minute – Friedberg continues to



support the Clinica Evangelica Morava in Ahaus, Honduras. Last year, the Moravian Clinic in Ahaus treated 3,103 outpatients, admitted 878 patients, oversaw 204 births, and performed 286 surgeries. The infant feeding program continues to provide daily meals to three sites for about

150 children. Through the work of the chaplain, nurses and other medical staff, the spiritual work of the clinic comforts patients in time of need and shares the Good News of Christ's salvation.

Hospital Sisters Mission Outreach in Springfield, IL is sending over 21,000 items to the clinic. Items include sutures, syringes, gauze, sheets, microscope slides, hypodermic needles, hospital beds, etc. The total

estimated value is \$265,426. The Friedberg Mission Committee is donating \$5,000 to help cover the cost of international shipping.

In January 2026, the Friedberg Congregation is sending a Medical/Building Team to Honduras. The team will consist of 12 people and is led by Debbie James.

Please pray for the Ahaus Clinic, the doctors, nurses and volunteers who work there. Also, the medical supplies donated by the Hospital Sisters Mission Outreach will arrive in Ahaus soon. Pray for the upcoming mission of the Friedberg team.

The Blessing Box requested item of the month is Convenience Foods for Kids. These items are normally



sold in portion-controlled, singe-serving packaging and are usually ready to eat without further preparation.

During the summer months, many children are alone during the daytime, so they are tasked with feeding themselves. The need is

great for convenience foods during the next few months. As always, items that are easy to open are preferred, especially for smaller hands, and cans with pop-tops are best. Here is a short list to consider:

- Fruit cups
- Trail mix
- Packs of crackers/nabs
- Granola/protein bars
- Dried fruit
- Apple sauce
- Pop-Tarts
- Individual boxes of cereal
- Pasta cups (such as Chef Boyardee)

We regularly have two and three generations of families sitting together, an aspect about which we are enormously gratified.

We have wanted to try some different things, and July offers us an opportunity to do just that. Since "First Friday" falls on Independence Day, we are organizing an evening meal in its place. We also have been interested in opportunities to recognize law enforcement, fire fighters, and EMTs – our first responders.


Our vision is taking shape as an annual evening meal in July (catered – giving our loyal, early-rising, hardworking kitchen crew a month off!) that spotlights a local first responder agency from Davidson or Forsyth County. This inaugural event is planned for <u>Thursday</u>, <u>July 17th</u> and honors the Davidson County Sheriff's Office. 


