# From the Depths to the Sky

Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation The old has passed away; behold, the new has come. (2 Corinthinas 5:17, ESV)

I've always found dragonflies fascinating. There's something about them that captures my imagination. Maybe it's their beauty — the way the sunlight shimmers off their wings like stained glass. Maybe it's their grace

in flight — darting, hovering, gliding with an ease that seems almost supernatural. Or maybe it's their stillness — their quiet patience as they perch motionless on a branch or reed, watching the world from a distance.

As I sit here writing, one just landed on the tip of a tree branch about 15 feet from where I'm sitting on my back porch. It's been flitting off and then returning again and again, always settling back in the same spot, like it knows it's being watched. It feels like a little gift from God. A reminder that beauty, stillness, and

purpose often show up when we slow down long enough to notice.

But what many people don't know is that the dragonfly's life is not all sun and flight. In fact, the dragonfly spends most of its life in a very different place: underwater.

Before it ever takes to the skies, a dragonfly begins as a nymph, living in the muck and mud at the bottom of ponds or streams. It stays there — not for days or weeks — but for as long as five years, depending on the species. During that time, it creeps through the shadows, molting and growing, unseen by the world above. It's a creature of the depths.

Then one day, something changes. The nymph senses it's time. It crawls out of the water, latches onto a reed or branch, and begins to undergo a transformation. Its back splits open. Wings unfold. The old life is left behind, and

a new one begins. What was once hidden, crawling, and earthbound is now light, free, and soaring through the air

It's a remarkable image of what happens to us when we encounter Jesus Christ — we are forever changed. The apostle Paul says, "If anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation. The old has passed away; behold, the new has come." (2 Corinthians 5:17)

This isn't just religious language. It's reality. We aren't merely improved versions of our old selves. We are transformed. Our past (failures and regrets, sin and shame) doesn't define us anymore. Christ does. And He

makes all things new.

Many of us have spent seasons in the depths — times when our lives have felt murky or dark. Maybe you've been there recently or perhaps you're there right now. The good news is that God doesn't leave us in the mud. He does some of His deepest, most formative work when we're out of view — shaping us, strengthening us, preparing us for what's next.

When the time is right, He lifts us up. And like the dragonfly emerging from the water, we are made to rise, shine, and live

with grace and purpose in the light of God's great love.

And yes, like the dragonfly, our time here is short. Most adult dragonflies only live a few months after their transformation. But what wonderful beauty they bring to the world in that time! And how much more so for us, who have been given new life not only for this world, but for eternity.

So the next time you see a dragonfly — whether gliding silently over a pond or pausing for a moment in the sunshine — remember: it's more than just a bug with wings. It's a whisper from creation about the wonder of resurrection, the power of transformation, and the goodness of God who lifts us from the depths to the sky.

clothes and bring an extra set, towel, and sunscreen. Feel free to invite a friend to join in the fun!






