Honoring Marriage and Singleness in the Body of Christ

Let each person lead the life that the Lord has assigned to them, and to which God has called them. (1 Corinthians 7:17, NRSV)

Every year on the second Sunday of October, our congregation gathers for a special celebration known as the Married People's Covenant Lovefeast. It is a beloved tradition that lifts up the beauty and significance of Christian marriage — a covenant rooted in Christ,

sustained by grace, and lived out daily in love, forgiveness, faithfulness, and service.

Marriage is indeed a holy calling. It is not always easy, but it is always sacred. Those who have walked its path for years know both the trials and the triumphs. In marriage, we are shaped not just by our joys, but by how we weather life's storms together. In a


world that often reduces marriage to mere romance or personal fulfillment, the Church proclaims something deeper: that marriage is a living picture of Christ's covenant love for His people (Ephesians 5:25–33). It is a daily opportunity to choose grace, to practice forgiveness, and to reflect God's enduring faithfulness. Our culture may often celebrate weddings more than marriages, but the Church is called to honor the quiet strength of covenant-keeping love over time.

But as we honor and celebrate marriage, we must also affirm another sacred calling that has often gone unspoken: the call to live faithfully as a single person. It is a calling that deserves both our respect and our recognition.

Scripture is clear that singleness is not a lesser life, but a different (and equally valuable) vocation. Jesus lived a single life. So did the apostle Paul, who described singleness as a gift that allows for undivided devotion to the Lord (1 Corinthians 7:32–35). The early church was filled with men and women — single, widowed, celibate

— whose lives were radiant with purpose and holy joy. Their lives remind us that completeness comes not through another person, but through Christ alone.

We are richly blessed at Friedberg by women and men who live out this calling today. Some are teachers and leaders, others are mentors, prayer warriors, or quiet servants. Some have chosen a single life. Others have found themselves in it unexpectedly. All of them are beloved members of Christ's body whose lives witness to the sufficiency of God's love and the richness of Christian community. We are wise to recognize that their contributions are not secondary — they are essential.



In a culture (and sometimes even in church life) that places so much emphasis on marriage and family, it is all too easy to overlook or unintentionally marginalize those who are not married. Let us do better. Let us celebrate faithfulness wherever it is found — whether in the long years of marriage or in the sacred quiet of a single life lived for Christ.

As we prepare for this year's Married People's Covenant Lovefeast, let us give thanks for the gift of covenant love—and let us also give thanks for the gift of every single sister and brother in our congregation. We are not whole without each other. Together, we reflect the fullness of Christ's body: married and single, young and old, every season of life pointing to His eternal love.

Suggested Prayer: Lord Jesus, who walked this earth as a single man and poured Yourself out in love for all, we thank You for the gift of marriage and the gift of singleness. Bless those joined in holy covenant, that their love may reflect Yours. Strengthen those who walk the single path, that they may know the joy of belonging fully to You. Help us be a church where every calling is honored, every life is cherished, and every heart finds its place. Amen.

What are some things that easily capture our attention and admiration? How can we help each other remember that God's greatness surpasses anything else we might be tempted to prioritize?




