




- 1. God gives people to guide us. (John the Baptist Is Born: Luke 1:5-25, 57-66; Matthew 3:1-6)

- How can Jesus' light help us make good choices at school, home, or with friends?


#### **Try This Together**

#### **Prayer**


Dear Jesus, thank You for being our light. Help us to follow You every day so we don't walk in darkness. Show us the right path and help us share Your light with others. Amen.

1 Thessalonians 5:16-18 "Rejoice always, pray continually, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus."

Life gets busy – school, sports, friends, social media, pressure, expectations. It's easy to focus on what's going wrong or what we wish we had. But God asks us to do something surprisingly powerful: give thanks in all circumstances. Not for every situation, but in every situation. Gratitude doesn't ignore the hard stuff; it shifts our perspective to see God's goodness even in the middle of it.

When you choose gratitude, your attitude changes, negativity loses power, you start noticing the blessings you missed before, and you draw closer to God because you see how He is working around you.

- 1. What's one thing you've been complaining about lately?
- 2. What part of that situation could you choose to thank God for?
- 3. Who is someone you take for granted but are actually grateful for?
- 4. What small blessings did you overlook today?


