What's in a Title?

All three of my kids had been in school for a full year, and I had kept my promise to not start anything new that first year when I no longer had any kids at home with me. But now, I was excited to finally start seminary, a call that I was sure God had placed on my life. In September of 2023, I began my Master of Divinity degree at Gordon Conwell Theological Seminary. I love school, and I love Jesus, so I was very excited to finally begin seminary classes. My new title would be **SEMINARY STUDENT**. I knew I was only going to be able to go part-time because of the other responsibilities I had as a mom and business owner, but I thought the five years it would take to complete my degree would give God and I enough time to figure out what my next steps would be. God's plan, as usual, was different than mine.

We celebrated the retirement of our Associate Pastor, Dan Nelson, in February of 2025, and with that came a shift in pastoral responsibilities. I volunteered to help Pastor Jim with leading worship just to take some of the extra responsibility off of him while Friedberg was in a time of transition. It is such a privilege to work with Pastor Jim again in ministry and to serve at Friedberg once again. (He was the Associate Pastor when I was hired as the Director of Youth Ministry at Friedberg in 2008.) Through a process of discernment and prayer, Friedberg's Board of Elders and Board of Trustees offered to hire me as a Pastoral Assistant in May. I began working part-time and helping with the pastoral responsibilities here at Friedberg. My new title was **PASTORAL ASSISTANT**. It is with great joy that I serve at Friedberg, and it has been a great blessing to my family.



The next step that God has led me to is applying to be a candidate for ordination in the Moravian Church. This process has taken many months, and it included an interview and meetings with the Moravian Commission on Ministry and an all-day psychological evaluation. I was approved in November and received another new title as a **CANDIDATE FOR ORDINATION**. This title allows me to assist in duties similar to an acolyte, helping with communion and baptisms. I still have several requirements to complete before being eligible for ordination in the Moravian Church. I must first graduate seminary, and my expected graduation is May of 2028. I will also have some Moravian-specific courses I must complete, including Moravian history and polity. I must also complete a clinical pastoral education requirement which focuses on pastoral visitation.

I am on staff here at Friedberg, but I am not under call like an ordained pastor is. It is important to me to note that I am, however, under call to God. Whatever title I might wear, it is God who has called me to it, and my prayer is to be obedient to his call on my life. Psalm 143:11 says, "for your name's sake, O Lord, preserve my life." My prayer is the same as David's in this Psalm. I pray that God preserves my life for His name and for His glory. And that is my encouragement for you. What title do you wear? Maybe your title is Dad, Grandma, Business Owner, Retiree, Student, Salesman, Teacher. Whatever title we wear, let us remember that we are all under call to God, a call to bring Him glory and to share His Good News of love and salvation with all we meet.

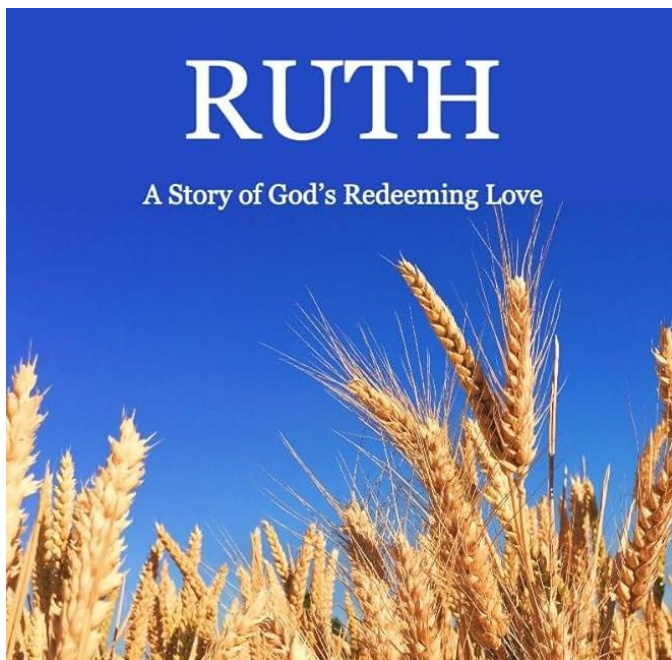

Sunday, January 4, 11, 18 and 25 during the 11:00am service

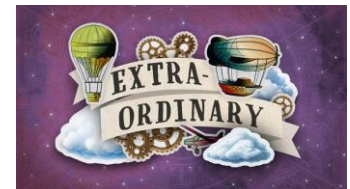

We invite you to join us for Sunday School each Sunday morning as children split up into more age specific small groups and dive deeper into our monthly verse and themes. They have loving Sunday School teachers with awesome plans ready to go for them to help each child learn more about what plans God has for each of their lives. Our Little Explorers (2 and 3 year olds) are continuing to learn from the Little Bible Heroes and will be meeting Samuel and learning about Christams this month.



The rest of our classes will continue our work in GROW with "Extra-Ordinary". January's verse to focus on will be:

The Name Above All Names

Scripture: "Therefore God exalted him to the highest place and gave him the name that is above every name." — Philippians 2:9 (NIV)

Find a cozy spot in your living room or around the kitchen table. Have everyone sit in a circle if possible. Go around the circle and have each person say their name loudly, then whisper it, then say it in a silly voice!

Talk about these things: "Why are our names important? They tell people who we are! We're learning about the most important name in the whole world—Jesus!"

The Bible Story

Parent reads or tells the story:

"Jesus is God's Son, but when He came to earth, He didn't act like He was better than everyone else. He helped people, healed sick people, and was kind to everyone—even people nobody else liked. Jesus loved us SO much that He died on the cross for us.

Because Jesus was so loving and obedient, God gave Him the highest place in heaven and the greatest name ever! Jesus' name is more powerful than any king, any superhero, or anyone else you can think of!"

Read this verse together: Philippians 2:9

Talk about these questions as a family:

- "Can you think of someone really important?" (President, principal, etc.)
- "Jesus' name is even MORE important than that! How does that make you feel?"
- "When we say Jesus' name, we're talking about the most powerful person ever!"

Name Tag Game

What you need:

- Sticky notes or masking tape
- Markers

What to do:

1. Write different names/titles of Jesus on sticky notes (one per note)
2. Stick them all over the room—on walls, furniture, doors
3. Have kids run around collecting them and reading them out loud as they find them
4. Gather back together and let kids stick their favorites on their shirts

Names to use: Jesus, King, Savior, Lord, Prince of Peace, Good Shepherd, Friend, Healer, Teacher, Messiah, Emmanuel, Son of God

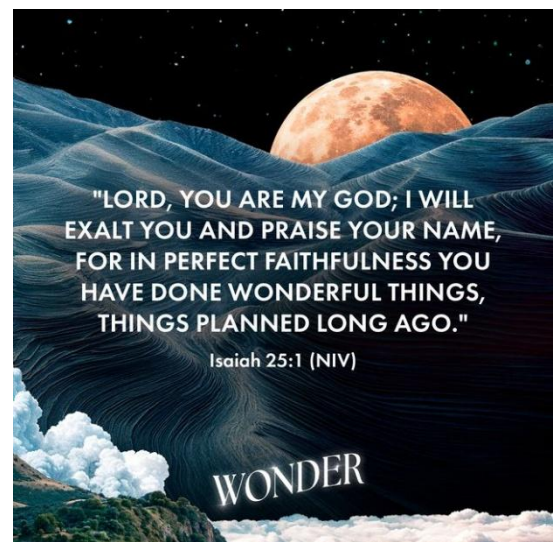


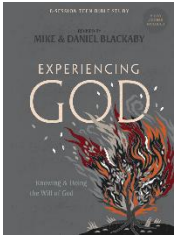
Youth

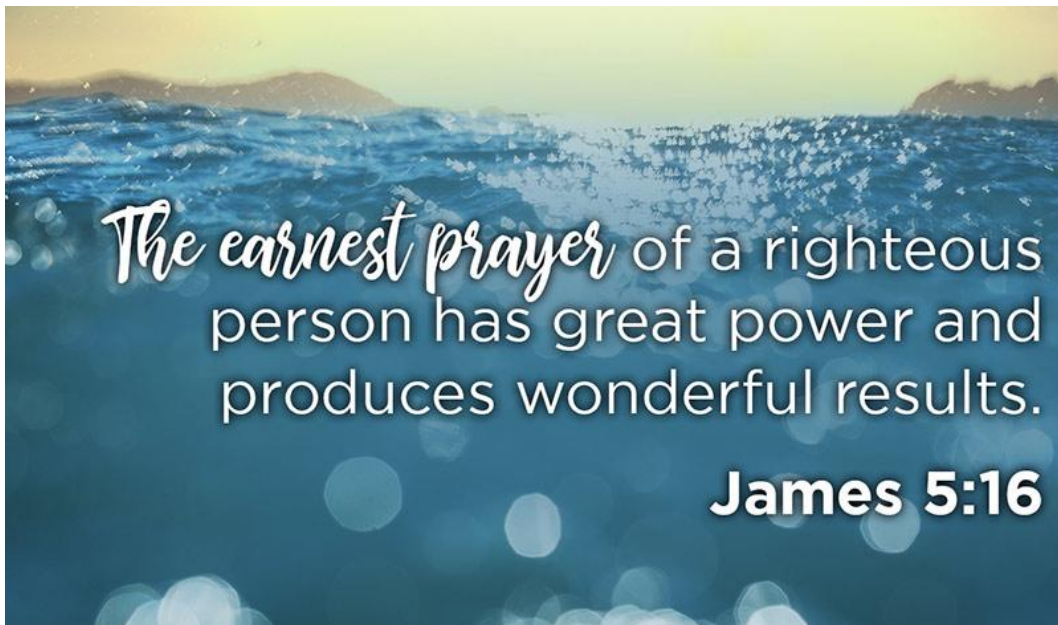
