Let's Remember

*Remember the days of old;
consider the generations long past.*
(2 Timothy 4:3, NIV)

This year our nation marks the 250th anniversary of the signing of the Declaration of Independence. Such anniversaries invite reflection. They encourage us to look backward with gratitude, inward with honesty, and forward with prayerful hope.

As Christians, remembering is not merely an act of nostalgia; it is an act of gratitude, humility, and renewed responsibility.

Memorial Day especially reminds us that many of the freedoms we enjoy today came at a tremendous cost. Generation after generation of men and women have served and sacrificed — some giving their very lives — so that others might live in freedom. Their courage and devotion deserve to be honored.

Yet remembering involves more than recalling battles fought and victories won. It also calls us to reflect upon the deeper spiritual and moral foundations that sustain a people and nation.

Throughout Scripture, God repeatedly calls His people to remember how He has led and blessed them. We are encouraged to remember His commandments, follow His Son who died and rose again for us, and live faithfully and humbly as His people — sharing His love and saving truth with a world in need of the hope He alone can give.

Nations, like individuals, can suffer from forgetfulness.

It is possible to enjoy blessings while forgetting their source. It is possible to become prosperous while neglecting the virtues and values that helped produce that prosperity. It is possible to become so consumed by division, anger, fear, and endless noise that we lose sight of wisdom, humility, and our need for God's guidance.

In many ways, ours is a time filled with anxiety and uncertainty. Public trust has eroded. Civic discourse has become increasingly harsh. People often seem quicker to condemn than to listen, quicker to fear than to hope. The

constant flood of information surrounding us can easily leave us weary, cynical, and spiritually exhausted.

As Christians, however, we are called to live differently. We are called to be people of truth, grace, compassion, courage, prayer, and hope. We are called not to place our ultimate trust in political parties, earthly leaders, or national strength, but in God alone. Our deepest allegiance belongs to Jesus Christ and His eternal Kingdom.

At the same time, Christians should never become indifferent to the welfare of the communities and nations in which God has placed us. Gratitude for our country, prayer for its leaders, concern for its moral and spiritual health, and a desire to serve our neighbors are all appropriate expressions of Christian citizenship.



As part of our observance of America's 250th anniversary, we will hold a Patriotic Lovefeast during our worship service on Sunday, June 28th. There will be beautiful anthems from our choir; the serving of a simple meal of coffee and bun; heartfelt prayers of intercession; and the proclamation

of God's Word. Together we will give thanks for the blessings we have received, honor the sacrifices that helped preserve our freedoms, and seek God's wisdom and mercy for the days ahead.

The Moravian Church has long emphasized that Christ calls us to be people of reconciliation, humility, and hope. In a divided and anxious age, those virtues matter more than ever.

As we remember the past, may we also renew our commitment to live faithfully in the present. May we be grateful without arrogance, concerned without despair, patriotic without bitterness, and above all, firmly grounded in Christ.

For ultimately, our hope rests not in nations or governments, but in the Lord who reigns over all generations.

Some Preteen Insight!!!

I had the opportunity to talk with some of our Pre-Teens in the Children's Ministry this past month. I asked if they would mind me sharing some of their thoughts on some topics I discussed with them. Here are some things you might not know about Pre-Teens or maybe you do!! Either way, enjoy the insight from these three kiddos!

1. What is one thing that is hard about being a preteen today?

Rose: I would have to say that the hardest part about being a preteen would be how you want to be older but your at the age where you do stuff with little kids while you are expected to be mature and act older. You are still not quite middle school so you have to stay with the elementary group.

David: We are underestimated. People think we are like teens, but we're different.

Eloise: All the homework and school!! And all the chores I have to do.



2. What do you think adults think about preteens? Is what they think about preteens true?

Rose: These are things people think-we are immature...FALSE!! People really underestimate what I am capable of.

David: I think adults think of preteens as kids that have some teen qualities but some kid qualities because we are in between... 1/2 teen and 1/2 kid! It's true!

Eloise: Adults think we have a lot of attitude. And even though we are moody, we are awesome! And that we stink!! It's all true!

3. Why does your faith matter to you?

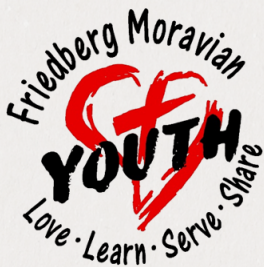

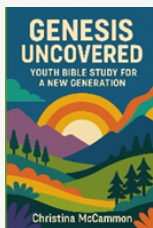
New to Youth - June 14th (4:30 - 6:30)

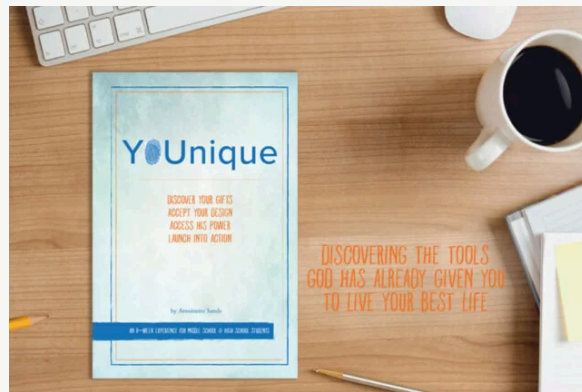

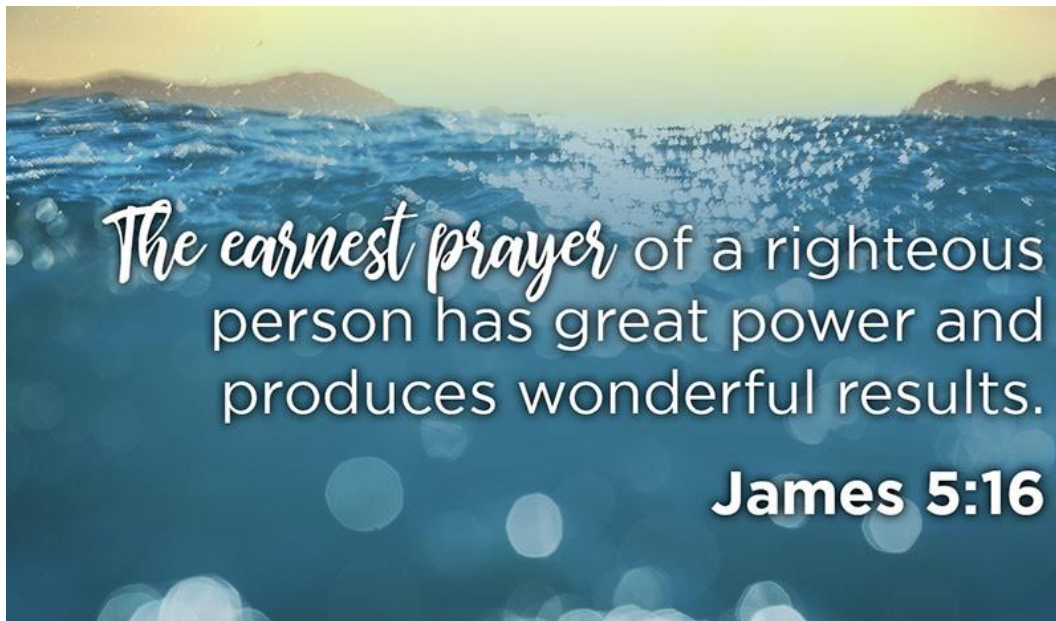
