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Dear Friends at Friedberg Moravian Church.

This is a very important time in the history of Wachovia Historical Society, Inc. and in the history of Friedberg Moravian church. Established in 1895, WHS is one of the oldest historical societies in the United States, and the oldest in North Carolina.

With our decision to proceed, after 100 years, with the development of the Adam & Maria Spach Park on the 6.27-acre tract listed on the National Register of Historic Places, and now to be shared with the public for generations to come, we need your help.

As you all know, Adam & Maria founded Friedberg Church by holding the first service in their home on November 27, 1759. They later gave the property on which both the church and God's Acre currently exist. They assisted in the founding of Friedland and Hope and Home Moravian Churches as well. They were revered as leaders in the Moravian community through their religious, social, and economic contributions to this area of the Piedmont.

We were very fortunate to have received grants from various sources including the State of North Carolina which have taken us far in the completing the elements of the Park that were proposed in the Master Plan. These include the widening of the road into the park for vehicles, the creation of a parking area, the preparation of walking trails and completion of the monument area along with extensive removal of undergrowth, debris and dead trees throughout.

As you can see in the pictures, we have the beginnings of a beautiful and serene Park, already being walked by many residents in the area, and even out-of-state visitors. However, due to cutbacks in both Federal and state funding, grants were denied that we anticipated receiving, which has resulted in a shortfall of approximately \$30,000. Items remaining include completion of our landscaping plan, park benches, a historical plaque for the monument site, a lucite well cover, interpretation of three former buildings and historical signage throughout the Park.

An especially meaningful way of contributing would be the purchase for \$1,000 of one of the park benches to be placed throughout the park (picture attached). You can commemorate a loved one or family members with a brass plaque that we will place on the back of the bench.

Would you be able to help us complete the Adam & Maria Spach Park? We are very grateful for our faithful supporters who have brought us this far and we have worked hard to earn your trust. 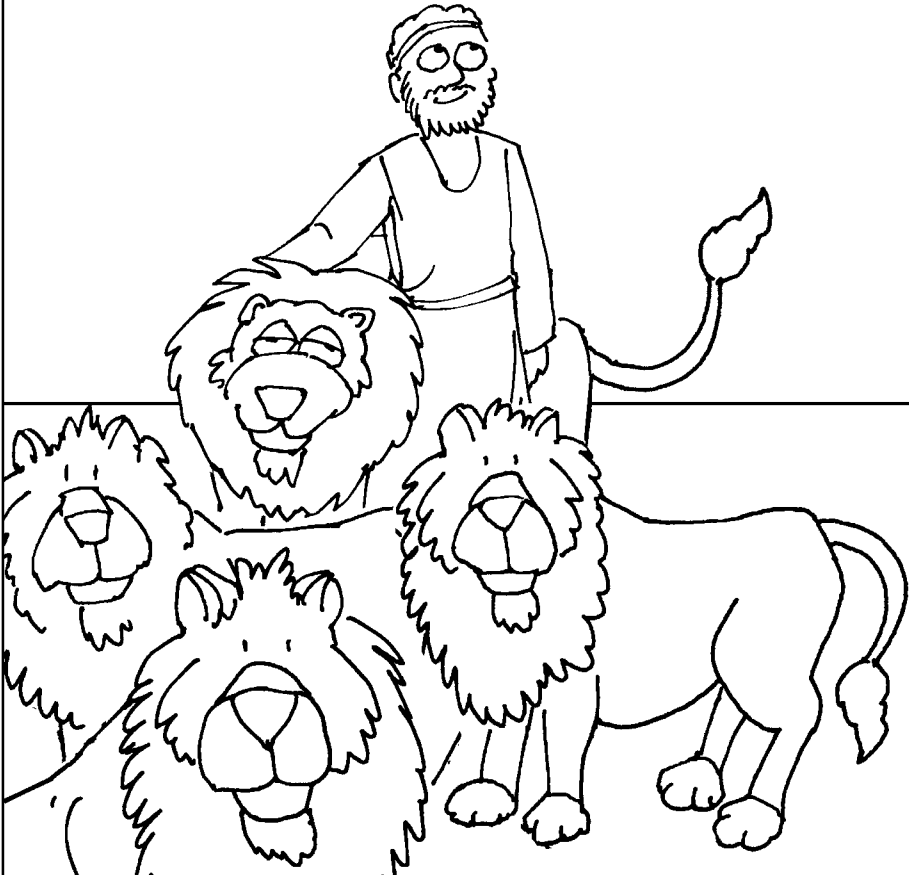
