Every four years, the FIFA World Cup captures the attention of millions around the globe. This summer was no exception. Fans traveled thousands of miles from Europe and every corner of the world to attend matches played here in the United States. They came to cheer for their national teams, to experience the excitement of world-class competition, and to be part of one of the greatest sporting events on earth.

But something interesting happened along the way.

As I watched online videos posted by visiting fans, I noticed a common theme. Many spoke warmly about their experiences in America. They talked about the friendliness of people they met in airports, restaurants, hotels, and neighborhoods. They were impressed by the beauty and diversity of our country, the generosity of complete strangers, and the sense of openness they encountered. More than a few admitted that, when it was time to return home, they wished they could have stayed a little longer.

They came to see soccer. They left talking about something else. That struck me because it reminded me how easily we become blind to the blessings that surround us every day.

Living somewhere year after year has a way of changing our perspective. We naturally notice traffic jams, political disagreements, rising prices, and the problems that fill the evening news. Every nation has flaws. Ours certainly does. Christians should never ignore injustice, excuse sin, or pretend that everything is as it ought to be. But neither should we become so focused on what is wrong that we lose sight of what is right.

Sometimes it takes the eyes of a visitor to help us see gifts that have become so familiar we hardly notice them anymore. The more I thought about it, the more I



realized that this is not just true of our country. It is true of life.

This past year has reminded me in fresh ways that every day is a gift from God. Health is a gift. Family is a gift. Friends are a gift. The privilege of serving Christ through His Church is a gift. The freedom to gather openly for worship, to open God's Word without fear, to pray together, to sing together, and to share

the hope of the gospel — these are gifts that millions of believers around the world do not enjoy freely as we do.

Sadly, the blessings we experience most often are all too often the ones we appreciate the least. We become accustomed to grace. We begin to assume tomorrow is guaranteed. We expect another Sunday to worship together. Another opportunity to hug someone we love. Another chance to encourage a friend. Another sunrise. Another ordinary day. Until one day we are reminded that none of those things are ordinary at all.

Scripture repeatedly calls God's people to remember. We remember His mighty acts. We remember His faithfulness. We remember His promises. We remember His steadfast love.

Remembering is not an exercise in nostalgia. It is an act of faith.

When we remember God's faithfulness yesterday, we gain confidence for tomorrow.

Perhaps that is one of the gifts these World Cup visitors have given us without even realizing it. By seeing our country with fresh eyes, they invite us to see our own lives with fresh eyes as well.

What blessings have become so familiar that we no longer notice them?

What mercies have become so routine that we seldom stop to thank the One who gives them?

What evidence of God's goodness have we overlooked simply because it has been present all along?

As summer gives way to another fall ministry season, I hope each of us will ask the Lord to renew our vision. May He help us see our homes, our families, our church, our community, and yes, even our nation, through eyes of gratitude rather than complacency.

After all, gratitude changes the way we face the future.

People who remember God's faithfulness do not have to fear tomorrow. We may not know what the coming months will bring, but we know the One who already stands there waiting for us.

The God who has sustained us through every season of the past has not changed, and He will not change now.

The writer of Hebrews reminds us, "*Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever*" (Hebrews 13:8). That is where our confidence rests.

We can learn something from those visitors who crossed an ocean expecting one experience and discovered another. We can learn to see familiar blessings with fresh eyes. We can learn to thank God more often for His abundant goodness. As we learn, the gratitude in our hearts will grow and give us quiet confidence as we follow Christ into whatever lies ahead.

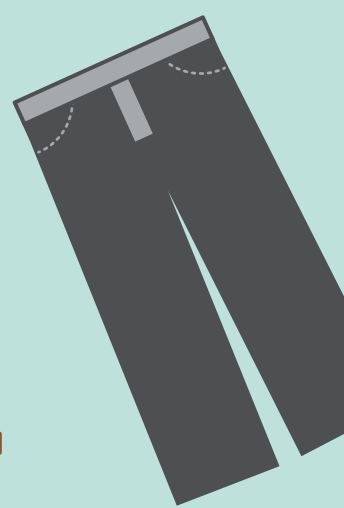

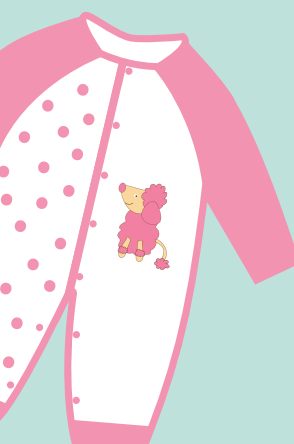

CHILDREN'S WORSHIP OPPORTUNITIES

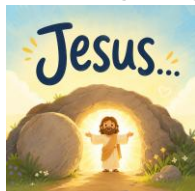
Sunday, August 2, 9, 23 and 30 during the 11:00am service

Talk: God's plans never change, and they are always good—even when we don't understand them.

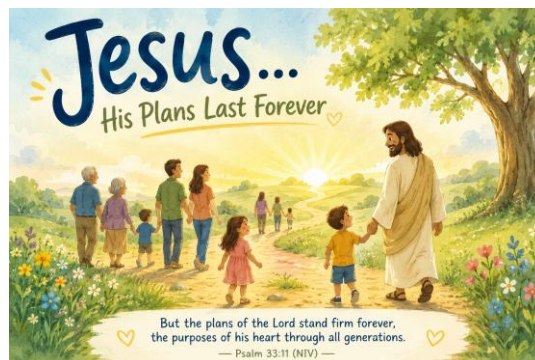
Do: Have each family member draw or write one thing they're trusting God with this week. Pray over each one together.

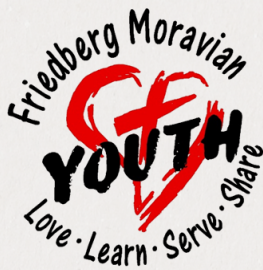

Summer Bible Study

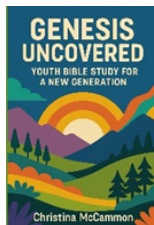

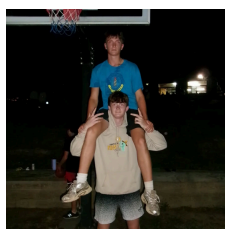

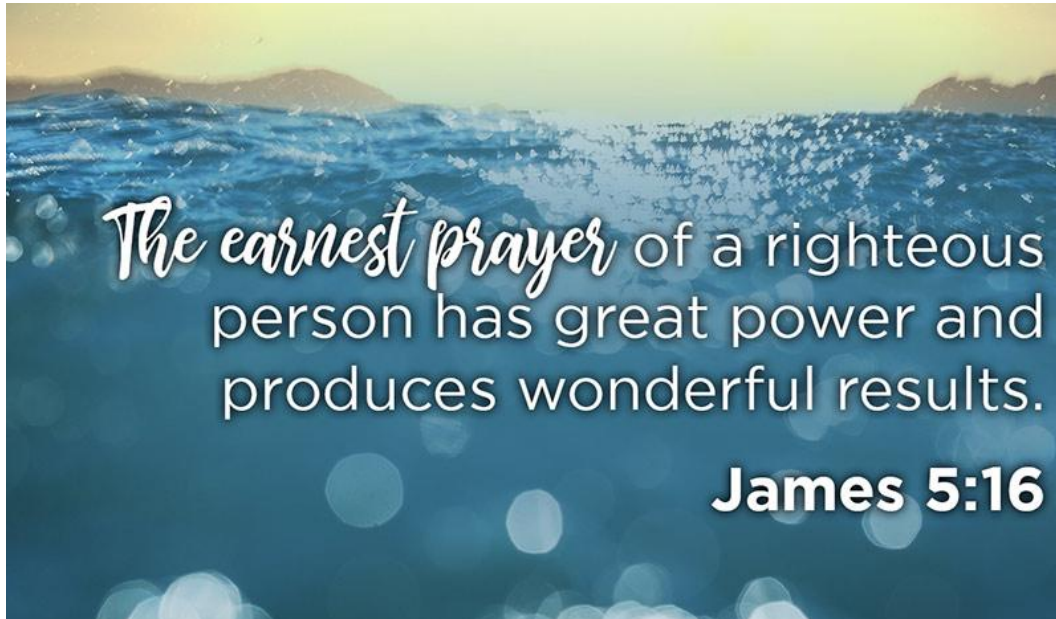
